

THIS bonkers result showed how far Enfield had fallen since the clubs met as Conference rivals in the late 1980s. While the

Stones were clawing their way back up the pyramid (and would win promotion to the Ryman Premier League via a play-off at the end of this season) the Es were in their early death throes

Their fans had deserted them two years previously to form a new club, Enfield Town, following a row with the Chairman over the sale of Enfield's historic Southbury Road ground. And now the Es, freshly relegated from the Ryman Prem, found themselves playing at Boreham Wood in front of less than 100 of their remaining supporters.

The Stones rolled into town on the back of ten wins from their last 11 games, which had pushed Gordon

Bartlett's side to the brink of an unlikely chance of promotion the top six would form part of the next year's Ryman Prem,

with most of the Prem clubs (together with the top Southern League Prem clubs) forming the new Conference South set-up.

Currently occupying that sixth spot, we needed maximum points at Meadow Park against already-

IF YOU are old enough to have enjoyed Enfield 0 Wealdstone 1 (Conference top-of-the-table clash, January 1983) and Enfield 0 Wealdstone 2 (FA Trophy Semi-Final, 1st leg, April 1985), how did Saturday's 8-0 whitewash of the Es compare? Pretty favourably, actually, was the general opinion among the old lags on the Meadow Park terraces. Maybe the game was not quite as important (although the rampant scoreline was as good as an extra point in our promotion quest) and clearly this Enfield side weren't quite as good as Eddie Enfield side weren't quite as good as Eddie McCluskey's mid-1980s vintage but it still extraordi-

narily satisfying to thump ANY Enfield side. For the record, after a goalless 1st half, Danny Tilbury cracked a glorious left-foot opener on the volley; Gary McKeown's 20-yarder made it 2-0; Richard Jolly's Thierry Henry-like strike made it three; Tommy Willliams whipped-in cross set up Tilbury for 4-0; Tommy himself saw a 25-yard shot bobble under the unfortunate Collier for five; then substitute Jermaine Beckford came on and promptly scored three smart goals to wrap it up.
