#### One From Eddie Presland's Text-Book

Good afternoon, everybody, and another big welcome to Lower Mead Stadium for the visit of our Kentish seaside visitors, Ramsgate, in another vital Southern League clash. Well, we're certainly riding high on the crest of a wave at the moment, and had another splendid win at Wimbledon last Saturday in the F.A. Challenge Trophy, reaching the second round for the first time ever through a magnificent goal from Eddie Presland in the 42nd minute. Eddie is one of the finest strikers of the ball in the Southern League—real text-book stuff, hitting it with the instep and the toe pointed firmly to the ground—and the way he hammered that ball past Dickie Guy at Plough Lane was a joy to watch. Being confined to bed with 'flu, I had to miss the match, but I am told our defence was magnificent, with John McCormick and Eric Burgess never putting a foot wrong.

As most of you will know, we are at home to Hastings Utd in the next round on February 2nd. Hastings beat Barnet in last Saturday's round and it will be no push-over. Indeed they gave us a tremendous battle in the league here recently before we won 2-1 but what we have done once we can do again. Incidentally, the February 2nd winners will have reached the last 16, so all of a sudden the twin towers of Wembley aren't the specks on the horizon they appeared some weeks ago! But enough of talk like that . . .

Well, we've now gone no fewer than nine matches unbeaten, and because we have so many games in hand, as you can see, we could hardly be better placed. Week after week other results continue to favour us, and Ramsgate officials told us this week that it was impossible to get a bet on for the 'Stones to win the championship! While we wouldn't go that far, we don't mind being quoted as saying we're in with a chance!! We have an old score to settle with Ramsgate, for they beat us 3-2 earlier in the season after having led 3-0 at the interval. But we're a lot tighter now, and look to consolidate our position today.

Quite apart from our results, what is delighting us all of course, is the mangnificent support we are getting, and our experiment of playing Bognor Regis a week last Sunday resulted in a gate of 1,300 despite the early start. Everyone is rallying round magnificently and underlines what many of us have always felt, namely that a successful team, playing attractive football, will bring in the fans.

Happily, we're at the stage now when a gate under 1000 is poor, and there is little doubt that if we are still going for promotion when the better weather comes, and the national emergency is over, we shall be approaching the 2000 mark. And as we need less than 1500 to be self-supporting the signs are most encouraging. We have the best attendances in either the North or South sections, by far, and better than the majority of Premier Division clubs.

For the statistically-minded, we last lost on November 24th, when Andover came here in that gale and thrashed us 5-1 for the freak result of the season!

In the meantime, thanks a lot for this tremendous support, which is playing a very big part in our success. Keep it up, and let's lift the boys again today . . .
