Boro crash to Harlow defeat

HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell accused his side of complacency after their 3-0 defeat at Harlow Town on Tuesday night.

The visitors appeared to be in control of the game at half-time, but three second half goals condemned them to another defeat, and left them struggling third bottom of the Ryman Premier Division after only one win from ten games.

Howell said: "We came out and dominated the first half and played some good football. But in the second half we just stopped playing.

"The only thing I can think of is that we were complacent. Maybe we thought we were playing well and it was only a matter of time before we scored. But it doesn't work like that.

"We forgot all the work we needed to put in and you cannot afford to become complacent."

Boro have a free weekend after their early exit from the FA Cup and Howell believes the extra time on the training ground can help them turn their season around.

"That is the only positive from the game," he said. "If we had won then we would have wanted to play on the weekend and keep the form going. But now we have time to work on things. There is a lot of hard work we have to put in.

"At the moment we are not killing teams off and not putting away our chances at crucial points. We will work on our defending because that's always important but we need to improve our attacking play at the other end of the park."

Boro managed a 1-1 draw at Earlsmead against Maidstone United on Saturday. The hosts looked to be heading for another defeat when Meshach Nugent fired United in front. But Jonathan Constant salvaged a point when he raced onto a long ball and fired it into the net.

Howell said: "We were peppering the goal and I couldn't believe that we were losing to them. But that has been the story of the last few weeks for us. We are doing so well but we are just not being clinical enough."
