Side all geared up for lucrative series

MIDDLESEX's 15-man squad has flown to Antigua for the Stanford Super Series in a bid to get their hands on a \$180,000 prize fund.

The cricket club will be playing three matches in five days, starting with Sun-day's game against England. They will complete the trip by facing

the Stanford Superstars on Thursday, October 30, but in between those two games they face Trinidad and Tobago for a pot of almost £110,000.

The main event in the series is the game between England and the Stanford Superstars, who will battle it out for \$20,000,000.

Middlesex earned the right to compete in the lucrative event after their sensational Twenty20 triumph at the Rose Bowl in July.

The club will be without Owais Shah as he is representing his country but the 30-year-old, who celebrated his birthday Wednesday, will be replaced by Andrew Strauss.

One of the members of the Middlesex squad is Watford-born fast bowler Steven Finn.

The 19-year-old said: "It's a massive stage for me as a young cricketer coming up through the Under-19s in my first full season.

"Every game is going to be a massive showcase. Financially, the Trinidad match is the biggest one but the press are making more of that than ourselves. No one really talks about the money.
