# **Shroot** tracked by Posh

HIGHLY-RATED Harrow Borough striker Robin Shroot is a transfer target for Peterborough after their director of football Barry Fry watched him hit a stunning winner at the weekend.

The 19-year-old celebrated his call-up to the Northern Ireland Under-21 squad by firing Boro to a 2-1 win over Dartford on Saturday in the Ryman Premiership. The victory was their first at home since March and lifted them off the bottom of the table.

Shroot has made a big impression since returning from a knee operation and has netted three goals in four games. His form convinced Fry to take a closer look and a number of non-league clubs including Wealdstone have also shown an

But Boro manager David Howell is convinced Shroot has

the talent to break into the professional game claiming he is one of the best youngsters he has worked with.

Howell said: "Albert Adomah [now at Barnet] was an explosive talent who got people off their feet. But Robin does it in a different way. He has great control and technique. Robin is very skillful and a natural footballer.

"Barry came to watch him and left at half-time so didn't see his goal. But I spoke to him afterwards and he was so impressed by what he saw he didn't need to stay long.

"Robin's attitude is spot on and he just wants to play football. He knew he was being watched but he didn't get

nervous. It didn't make any difference.

"If he is here at Christmas I will be very happy but if he is gone I will also be happy."

Shroot's sublime winner came after Boro had fallen behind to a first-half goal. But they recovered, as substitute Kurt Morlese equalised with a close-range finish midway through

Boro's next target is to climb above fellow strugglers Margate by winning at their rivals on Saturday afternoon.

### Striker set for Stones move
