Skipper Smith to end 15-year career

MIDDLESEX'S captain Ed Smith has left the club after he announced his retirement from first class cricket.

The right-handed batsman has been at Lords since 2005 and helped lead his side to their first trophy in 15 years when they lifted the Twenty20 Cup in the summer. He missed the final though after he broke his ankle last season and hasn't

The 31-year-old, who played for England three times, has written three books and the Cambridge University graduate will

now become a full-time writer.

The Arsenal fan said "It has been a real honour to captain Middlesex. I have been very lucky to play first class cricket for eight years at Kent and four years at Mid-

"I'd like to thank all the players, coaches and supporters who have helped me enjoy the game I love. I wish Shaun Udal and the team every success in the future."
Smith hit 34 hundreds as he scored

12,789 runs in his 191 first-class matches, averaging 41.79.

Middlesex chairman Ian Lovett believes Smith has made a huge contribution during his time at the club, both as a batsman and a captain.

He said: "Ed has always shown exceptionally high levels of energy, commitment and dedication to everything he does, and having taken over the captaincy when we were at a particularly low ebb on the field, he played a major role helping us achieve markedly improved results.

"This culminated in us winning our first trophy for fifteen years in this year's Twen-

ty20 competition.

"He is a man with a wide range of talents and I am sure he will make a great success of his future career.'
