## **Boro close** to signing goalkeeper

HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell hopes to bring in a goalkeeper this week to solve their injury crisis.

The Ryman Premier outfit have

already lost first-team shot stopper Andray Baptiste for several weeks with a knee problem and stand-in Gary Ross is doubtful for this weekend's trip to Maidstone United with a groin

injury.

Howell was close to bringing in a back-up goalkeeper, thought to be from League One or Two, on Wednesday lunchtime at the time of going to press.

Boro's unbeaten start to the New Year continued after a 3-1 win over Billericay Town at Earlsmead on Saturday, Howell's side recovered from conceding an early goal to post a vital win in the league.

Jonathan Constant equalised for Boro in the 36th minute with a classy

They took the lead for the first time midway through the second half when Lee Hall smashed the ball home from ten yards. Dewayne Clarke sealed the points for Boro in the 75th minute when he beat a defender and slotted the ball in from an acute angle.

Howell was delighted with his side's response after a disappointing start to the game.

He said: "It was a very sluggish start by us, we weren't at the races. But by the end of the match we could have won by more. It was good to see the likes of Jonathan Constant coming and putting in a positive performance

"In 2008 [first half of the season] we drew too many games. I think we drew eight games, more than anyone else, which we should have won which is 16 points lost. I told the players it is about the results this year. I would be happy

Howell takes his side to United— a team one place off the play-off spots—on Saturday and is confident of keeping the momentum going.
"They are on the edge of the play-

offs and they're a hard team to beat. Maidstone have spent a lot of money on new players but I felt we should have beaten them earlier in the season [1-1 draw].

"But we're going there on the back of a result against Godalming and a good win over Billericay so we're hoping to build on that at Maidstone."


The Rams dominated
