Borough in trouble after home collapse

HARROW BOROUGH dropped into the Ryman Premier relegation zone after losing 4-1 at home to Harlow Town on Saturday.

Boro defeated their rivals last week in the League Cup but they slumped to a confidence-sapping defeat at Earlsmead at the weekend. The hosts paid the price for a poor start to the game, in their first reversal of 2009, as they trailed 3-1 at half-time.

The visitors raced into an early lead after dominating the start of the match. Jamie Richards took the ball around goalkeeper Laurie Walker and slotted into the empty net. John Frendo added the second

after a speculative 30-yard strike flew into the top corner.

The hosts replied when Jonathan Constant fired the ball in after Dorian Smith headed on.

But Boro had no time to enjoy the goal as they conceded the third goal on 36 minutes when Mark Taylor converted a penalty.

Boro began the second half strongly and went close when Constant's header narrowly missed the post.

The decisive fourth goal for Harlow arrived after 60 minutes when Frendo calmly rounded Walker for his brace.

Boro's misery was sealed late on when Constant's penalty was easily

saved by the visiting goalkeeper.

Boro manager David Howell said: "The game was lost in the first 45 minutes when we didn't compete well enough. When we got back to 2-1, we looked quite bright, but we lost another goal within a few minutes. We never got close enough after a poor start.

"The elements played their part. We were up against a strong wind in the first half and we did not deal with it. We gave ourselves a mountain to climb."

Boro travel to Canvey Island on Saturday and Howell is set to welcome first-team goalkeeper Andray Baptiste back to the side after

Howell said: "We have to go to Canvey, regardless of the conditions, and do the best we can to get the three points to give us the lift we need.

"They are a very organised side who came up last season and have done well with a decent budget. We played them earlier in the season and we should have been five or six goals up after the first 20 minutes

- yet we ended up losing it 4-2.

"It's a game where we will be looking to make up for the disappointment of the Harlow result."
