Boro's 4-2 victory kept them out of the Ryman Premier relegation places and took hotshot Noel's tally to 12 goals in just nine starts. Noel marked his 19th birthday on Saturday with a man-of-the-match winning display.

Boro manager David Howell says the former Millwall

youngster is good enough to get back into professional football if he works on his game. Noel was plucked from obscurity at Dulwich Hamlet in December after their manager, Craig Roberts, described him as a "lazy player

Howell took a chance on Noel and was rewarded with four goals in as many games. But the striker was dropped after a dip in his performances and has only recently

returned to form for Boro.

Howell said: "He has got all the right attributes for a striker. He is good in the air, has pace, can hold the ball up and knows where the goal is.

"If he applies himself and works hard then he can defi-

nitely get back into league football.

"I think it was a bit of a culture shock playing non-league football and he got ahead of himself and his work rate dropped around Christmas. I left him out the team and he's now come back in so hopefully he has learned his lesson.

Howell rates him as highly as he did for previous talents such as Birmingham's Robin Shroot and Barnet's Albert Adomah.
