Ashe maintained his rich vein of form, with his fourth goal in three games, by heading in the winner after two minutes against promotion rivals Hornchurch.



## Howell bemoans attack

HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell is concerned by his blunt attack after they misfired for the second consecutive match.

Boro slipped into the relegation zone in the Ryman Premier after a frustrating 0-0 draw at home to Sutton United on Tuesday night. After their goalless draw at home to Tooting and Mitcham on Saturday, Boro were again unable to get the breakthrough at Earlsmead. It was their 11th draw this season, the most in the league, and Howell accepts his side need to start turning them

into wins.
"We have drawn too many games. What slightly perturbed me was that if we had won one and lost the other this week we would have ended up with more points than we did.

"I was disappointed with our play in the attacking third. We let the opposition off the hook by choosing the wrong options. If we make the right decisions, then the goals will start to come.
"We haven't attacked teams collectively

because the forwards have been playing as individuals. We have got into good posi-tions where we should have done better. We've let teams off lightly. The cohesion

going forward just hasn't been there."
Howell hopes his side can sharpen their attack on Saturday when they visit rivals Ashford Town. Boro are only two points behind them and a win could go a long way

towards helping them avoid the drop.

The manager said: "We go to Ashford and we beat them 1-0 earlier in the season. But we knocked them out of the League Cup last week when they were missing three or four regulars.

They will be looking to avenge that defeat but we know they are one of the teams that are catchable.
