## Bartlett pleads for cash to retain side

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett has appealed to supporters to help ensure their talented young squad is kept

The Stones have run into financial difficulties and last month launched 100:400 - a scheme designed to raise £40,000 for next year's playing budget. They have reached 75 per cent of their target but Bartlett fears he will have to break up the side if they do not get more backing.

Bartlett said: "I have had to break up the side so many times during my 14 years here and I don't want to be doing that again. I believe we have something special here and everyone

"The fact is there is a shortfall here and it needs a financial commitment from those who can afford it. We are nearly there but we need a last push to keep the current group of players so

we can look forward to an exciting campaign next year.

"There will be an awful lot of clubs cutting their budgets next season but I don't want us to be one of them. If we can keep our side together then I would expect us to be knocking on the door of the play-offs.

Wealdstone's promotion hopes ended on Saturday when they lost 3-1 at runaway champions Dover. The Stones suffered a poor start when they conceded after just four minutes.

The Stones fell further behind ten minutes into the second half before Andy Hessenthaler's side added the third. Weald-stone salvaged a late consolation through in-form striker Greg

Solve savaged a face consistency in though in-hor in striker of eg Ngoyi but it was too late to keep their play-off push alive. Bartlett said: "It was nice to be involved in the race and it was testament to how well we did in the season. It was brilliant to take it so far but I think it would have been too early to go up due to our financial restraints. What the players have achieved will stand them in good stead."
