Bartlett: We're not frightened of them

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett says he is not frightened about taking on early pacesetters Dartford this weekend.

The Stones face a trip on Saturday to the promotion favourites who have stormed to the top of the Ryman Premier after winning their first four matches. It does not get any easier as they return to Grosvenor Vale on Monday to face Sutton United.

Bartlett said: "It's certainly going to be very tricky but we're not frightened of facing them.

Everybody can beat each other in this league as you've seen because Dartford are the only side with a 100 per cent record. They have paid an awful lot of money and won 5-0 in their last game so they're the team to beat.

They were my tip at the start of the season alongside Carshalton and Sutton so if we can be in the middle of that lot then we will have had a decent year.

The Stones earned their first win of the season on Tuesday night after an early penalty from Ryan Ashe fired them to a 1-0 victory at Boreham Wood. Wealdstone also picked up a 2-2 draw at home to Maidstone United on Saturday after goals from Charlie Mpi and another Ashe penalty.

Bartlett was pleased with the effort of his side but believes there is still a lot more to come.

'Our energy levels were good," he said. "We stopped them from playing well and their manager complimented us on our work ethic. I thought we worked very hard. Our passing needed to be better but I was pleased to get the three points.

"It will take us a little bit of time to bed in but I'm happy with the

squad. I don't think we are anywhere near what we are capable of achieving vet.

The saga of Carl Martin's future dragged on as the defender played yesterday for Crewe Reserves. The talented youngster joined the League Two club on trial last month but has still not been offered a deal. It is understood Martin is unlikely to sign permanently for Crewe due to their financial constraints but a number of other clubs are thought to be chasing the 22-year-old.

Bartlett added: "I'm surprised it has taken this long to make a decision on him. I think it will be resolved by the end of this week.
