Howell unable to sign Clarke replacement

BOROUGH HARROW manager David Howell has accepted he will not be able to replace striker Dewayne Clarke.

The temperamental forward left the club last week to join Boreham Wood but Boro do not have the money to sign a replacement this season.

Howell said: "I haven't got the resources so we will just have to get on with it."

Boro's form has dipped alarmingly in the last month since Howell picked February's manager of the month award. His side have lost their last three Ryman Premier games and are without a win in their last six games.

The manager admitted: "We have had a bad patch ever since I won the award. I just think we need to get a win back under our belts to get us going again and hopefully that will come on Saturday.

Boro's latest setback was a 1-0 defeat at Sutton United on Tuesday night. Howell bemoaned the soft winner conceded but was encouraged by their display.

"We had a bright start and were the better team but then we gave away a schoolboy goal," he said.

"We had most of possession and created most of the chances. It was encouraging in terms of the performance and our commitment but the result was not very good at this stage.

But he was unhappy with his de's 3-1 home defeat to Tonbridge Angels last Saturday.
Howell said: "We gave away a

bad goal and never really settled giving the ball away cheaply. It was a below par performance.


"In the other games I felt we were a bit unfortunate but we didn't really put enough into this game. We made it easy for Tonbridge and they didn't have to work hard for the win.'

Howell accepts his side need to get a win under their belts, to avoid being dragged into the relegation dogfight, starting at home to Horsham on Saturday. He added: "I'm just concerned

by how we're playing and if we don't get back on track with three points then we will start to look over our shoulders.

But if we get two wins then all of a sudden it completely changes the situation."
