## News briefly

### Opening defeat for Saracens

SARACENS started their season with a 33-16 Premiership defeat to London Irish at Twickenham. The Men in Black led 10-6 at half time after tries from Ernst Joubert and Schalk Brits. But the match turned dramatically in favour of the Exiles in the second half with four tries sealing their win. Sarries play their first home game against Sale on Sunday.

### Tigers dumped out of Vase

KINGSBURY LONDON TIGERS crashed out of the FA Vase after a 1-0 home defeat to Southend Manor on Saturday. The breakthrough came for the visitors in the 82nd minute when Wilf Wisika headed home. Kingsbury tried desperately to salvage an equaliser but Gregory Ngeno's strike was saved.

## Borough hit form

HARROW BOROUGH bounced back from their crushing defeat at Cray Wanderers with a convincing 2-0 win over Lowestoft Town on Tuesday night.

Goals from Troy Hewitt and Kurt Morlese earned the win for Harrow in a game that shared some similarities to the previous defeat. Boro were hammered 5-1 on Saturday but produced the perfect response at Earlsmead.

Harrow were reduced to ten men in that game and the same fate met them on Tuesday as Danny Leech was given his marching orders after two bookable offences towards the end of the first half.

But the similarities between the two games ended there.

Manager David Howell said: "Last time we made it easy for the opposition when we went down to ten men.

"We contributed to our own downfall that day and we were not going to let that happen again."

Harrow Borough held on to keep a clean sheet, having learnt from Saturday's mistakes, in what Howell described as a "thoroughly deserved battling win".

The Ryman League Premier Division win over Lowestoft saw Howell hand debuts to three players from the reserve team due to injuries.

Howell praised his team stating: "This was the best second half performance of any Harrow Borough team I've managed".

Harrow Boro will look to build on this performance as they travel to Great Wakering Rovers on Saturday for a tricky FA Cup tie where a list of injuries mean Howell will not be taking anything for granted.

## Stones stung by Billericay

WEALDSTONE suffered their third defeat of the season after losing 1-0 at Billericay Town on Tuesday night.

The Stones endured a frustrating evening in Essex as their winless run in the Ryman Premier stretched to three games.

Wealdstone failed to post a win on Saturday after they were held to a goalless draw at home to Bury Town.

Gordon Bartlett's side were punished after Danny Burnell missed a penalty at the end of the first half.

The hosts dominated the match and applied plenty of pressure on Bury Town but were unable to provide the finishing touches.

Wealdstone were awarded the spot kick after 41 minutes when Wes Parker was pushed over in the box. But striker Burnell's effort was pushed away by goalkeeper Marcus Garnham.

Wealdstone upped the tempo after the break and came close to opening the scoring when Peter Dean lashed an effort which was parried by Garnham.

Bartlett's team continued to pile on the pressure but were finding it increasingly hard to break down the visitors' defence.

Greg Ngoyi was brought on as a substitute and Wealdstone created their best chance a minute later when Scott Fitzgerald's effort was brilliantly blocked on the line by the inspired shot stopper Garnham.

The Stones take a break from the league this weekend as they travel to Tring Athletic for the first qualifying round of the FA Cup.
