Wealdstone defeat Generals in replay

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett praised his players' attitudes after they put a major setback behind them to see off Chesham United in their FA Cup replay on Monday night.

The Stones were stung by a 97th minute equaliser in the 2-2 draw at the Meadow on Saturday but they responded impressively two days later when they eased past Chesham 4-1 at Grosvenor Vale to book a third qualifying round tie at unbeaten Metropolitan Police.

Bartlett said: "I thought we missed a great opportunity and when we conceded the equaliser it was a major blow for us. To concede so late was a real kick in the teeth for us. It was a major learning curve for the players in that they need to be professional in the last few minutes and not give late goals away

"But I thought the response and attitude of the team was all I could ask for. They responded really well and I was delighted with the work ethic of the team.

The Stones opened the scoring in the replay after a brilliant run from Kieron Forbes who went on a surging 75-yard attack down the right wing before pulling the ball back for Scott Fitzgerald to find the net.

Wealdstone doubled their advantage just before half time when Fitzgerald flicked the ball on for Peter Dean to squeeze in the second goal.

The visitors gave themselves hope in the second half when Rob Bartley's header crashed in off the crossbar. But the Stones replied with their third goal when Lee Chappell calmly curled the ball home from the edge of the

Bartlett's side confirmed their place in the next round 15 minutes from time when Dean ran clear to round the goalkeeper for the fourth.

Wealdstone will look to give their Ryman Premier campaign a muchneeded lift on Saturday when they host second-placed Lowestoft Town.

Bartlett added: "We go into every game hoping to do well and I still have faith in the squad. I couldn't tell you an awful lot about Lowestoft but we know they have made a good start and they will a difficult challenge.

In other news, striker Jon Douglas has left the club. The striker joined Wealdstone in the summer from Oxford City but was unable to make an impact in the first team.

Boro visit Hastings United on Saturday before entertaining Aveley on Tuesday night and Howell is looking for two performances to take into the FA Cup.

The manager added: "Hastings is a

difficult place to go and they have got a good squad there. But we're all travelling on the coach together and it will be good for the new lads to get to know each other.

"I think the league games are important going into the FA Cup tie. If we do well in the two matches then we will go into the cup raring to go. It's important to get the points and be in a positive frame of mind on the back of two good performances.
