Brilliant Borough net Chesterfield cup clash

HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell admits their 4-2 FA Cup scalp at Eastbourne Borough will go down as one of his greatest moments in football.

The Ryman Premier side booked their place in the first round of the competition for only the third time in their history and were rewarded with a lucrative home game against League Two table-toppers Chesterfield.

Howell, who was also at the club for their two other memorable runs in the FA Cup, said: "I'm chuffed because it was such an emotional day. I was pleased for the club and the players because they have done something that will go down

"I would put that right at the top of my victories. That has to go down as one of, if not the, highlight to date. Everyone said Eastbourne were very good and nobody fancied us going there. To play the way we did was just unbelievable. The game was won in the first half hour."

Boro made a sensational start to the cup tie as they built up a 3-0 lead inside the first half hour. The opening goal came after only five minutes when Ryan Watts' cross was headed home by Rocky Baptiste.

The second goal came after 21 minutes when Troy Hewitt found the net from 20 yards out. A close-range finish from Hewitt capped an extraordinary start for Howell's side and the striker completed his hat-trick four minutes into the second half. Two consolation efforts from Eastbourne could not deny Boro a famous cup triumph.

Howell admitted it was an emotional moment for him after

the death of his mother earlier this year.

"It's just been a really emotional experience," he said.

"With losing my mum in Easter I had a serious think about things and it would have been nice if she had been able to celebrate a sunny day with Boro after helping me through some rainy days. It was tinged with sadness although I'm really happy obviously.

"I'm delighted for the players, who have made a lot of

sacrifices playing for very little financial reward. It is no secret that the club doesn't have a lot of money but some players have come up to me and said it was the best day of their life. It was heartfelt and very emotional.

"We've been working very hard to achieve something here. We have always been fighting an uphill battle and it is just nice to share in some happiness with the club. We have a lot of players that have never experienced something like that before. This is what dreams are made of."

Boro have confirmed the Chesterfield match will take place at Earlsmead on Saturday, November 6 with a 2pm kick off.

Howell said: "It is a great draw and we want to play them in our own back yard and do battle with them. We're just pleased it's going to go ahead.'

Stones upset league leaders

"The last thing we want to do is face the same team two games on the trot. Every match is a priority and we are four games unbeaten so we need to keep the run going on Sunday."
