HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell believes a giantkilling win over Chesterfield in the FA Cup would represent the greatest achievement in the club's history.

The Ryman Premier outfit host the League Two leaders in the first round on Saturday afternoon in front of an expected crowd of 1,500 at Earlsmead. Boro are huge underdogs but Howell has called on his side to leave with no regrets.
