SARACENS have confirmed ambitious plan to leave Vicarage Road and move to Barnet Copthall Stadium from the start of next season.

The Watford-based rugby club held a press conference at Hendon Golf Club, which is directly next to Copthall, yesterday to present their detailed plans to the media.

Sarries stated they plan to spend up to £10m on the stadium which will be a 10,000-seater venue when Saracens play during the season and will have detachable stands which will be removed during the summer months.

The Men in Black will not own the

stadium despite the huge investment

and the athletics track will remain.

Chairman Nigel Wray stated the rugby club will use the stadium for first team matches for up to 16 days of the

For the rest of the time it will be utilised by various different clubs and organisations, including the Saracens Foundation and Shaftesbury Barnet Harriers.

The venue will have artificial turf which is a first for English rugby and chief executive Edward Griffiths confirmed the use of the pitch is within IRB regulations and has been given the thumbs up by the RFU.

Wray said: "We need a home with the

potential to ensure Saracens is

sustainable. Without a real home, I do not think major sports clubs will be sustainable.


"Barnet Copthall will provide that home and bring Premiership rugby back into North London which is really the heartland of the club.'

Griffiths stated the club hope to submit a planning application early in the New Year but there remain serious doubts as to whether the plans will be passed in time for next season.

Both Saracens' chief executive and

chairman refused to confirm what the club plan to do if they are unable to move into their new home next summer

Wray added: "When you propose to a girl, you do not have a plan B.
