Hewitt's strike doubled the lead before a late close-range finish from Dewayne Clarke. The victory was their fourth consecutive away win in the league and maintained their excellent form since their FA Cup defeat to Chesterfield in November.

Howell, whose side host Canvey Island on Saturday, said: "I have been impressed with the way the players have applied themselves since our cup exit. Two days after that we won at Aveley and since then we have kept our form going.

"We're in a good position only six points off the play-offs and just have to keep it going.

"It has left us a little thin on the ground so we would like to bring people in but we won't be panicking."


