HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell insists his team deserve to be in contention for the Ryman Premier play-offs.

The league's top scorers climbed up to fifth in the table after thrashing Horsham 6-0 on

Howell is adamant his side are there on merit after just one defeat in 15 league games.

The manager said: "It is a position we deserve to be in. It is not a freak run. We have been consistent for a long run now and the results have been good. The performances since October when we lost to Concord have been of a consistent nature and that is all I can ask from the players.

'We have set our sights on being consistent and making sure our performances are not up and down. If we continue this then the league will take care of itself.

Howell, who revealed the club

"The best thing for him to do is to play at Rangers this week and then look at the situation. It's not my place to say whether he should stay or go.

"Rocky and Troy have struck up a great partnership. The signs were there at the start of the season and they have got a personal battle going on between them.

"One scores a hat-trick and then the other seems to get one. The objective for them is to be the top scorers in the league. If they do that then we will be in a good place.'
