Boro stun Bury Town

HARROW BOROUGH manager David Howell believes his team have as good a chance as any of making the play-offs.

The Reds completed the double over second-placed Bury Town on Tuesday night to close within two points of the top-five. Howell said: "The league table

is so tight and it will keep changing constantly from week to week. But if we can keep winning then we will give ourselves as good a chance as any.

"As long as we can stay in touch with the group at the top, then we are in the running and it's all about timing our run for the end of the season. We are tucked away in the pack and we know we are still within touching distance.

Skipper Wayne Walters got the hosts off to a perfect start when he stroked the ball home from eight yards after just six minutes.

Boro sealed the 2-0 win in the second half when substitute Danny Hart drilled the ball past the goalkeeper.

Howell said: "It was a good performance and a well deserved win. It could have been a lot

"Bury are one of the form teams and to beat them 7-2 on aggregate is a good feat. They have had a great season and probably feel they are assured a play-off place but with eight games to go nothing is assured."

Boro were beaten 3-2 at Tooting and Mitcham on Saturday in a game which Howell thought they should have won.

The visitors took an early lead through Kurt Morlese but three goals put the game beyond them before a late penalty by Rocky

Baptiste.
"It was a missed opportunity," he said.

"It should have been over after the first 30 minutes when he had three one on ones and enough chances. That, coupled with poor defending, cost us the game.

Boro face a crucial home match against Ryman Premier play-off contenders Kingstonian on Saturday [1pm].

Howell added: "It's about beat-

ing your rivals and these are all six pointers.
"If we beat them then we go

ahead of them but if we lose then it just makes it that much harder

Stones sign Brunel winger

WEALDSTONE have signed Brunel University winger Peter Martin.

The right-sided player has joined until the end of the season, after impressing during several reserve games, and could be involved in their crucial match at Tonbridge Angels this weekend.

The Stones have gone on a 12-match unbeaten run in the Ryman Premier but badly need to extend the sequence at their third-placed rivals.

Stones boss Gordon Bartlett said: "With eight games to go realistically we need to win six of them [for the playoffs]. They are one of our rivals so we have to aim to go there and get a win."
Wealdstone had to settle for a frus-

trating 1-1 draw at home to Folkestone Invicta on Saturday. Bartlett was far from impressed with both his side's performance and also the referee's display.

Bartlett said: "I think it was a poor performance on our part. We certainly didn't play well but our performance was marginally better than the referee's.

"I thought he had a poor game. I could only remember one bad tackle and yet we had six yellow cards and a red.

"There were too many things to moan about and he had a bad day. Referees are going to make mistakes but it's important they learn from it.
