Play-off agony for Wealdstone

BARTLETT admitted Wealdstone's Ryman Premier Division semi-final exit at home to Concord Rangers was one of his toughest defeats as a manager.

The hosts were in complete control and led 1-0 but a late goal helped give the visitors a 2-1 extra-time win to shatter the Stones' promotion dreams.

Bartlett, whose side hit the woodwork four times, said: "Ten months of hard work was blown away in the last minute of our last game of the season and that hurts. It's a bitter pill and we have to reflect on why it happened.

"I think we did everything right other than the score. I don't know what we could do differently apart from shaving

A record crowd of 1,055 gathered at the Vale for the semi-final clash and the Stones repeatedly came close to leading in the first half.

Bartlett's side had to wait until the 62nd minute to open the scoring through Richard Jolly's header in his final appearance before retirement.

Concord snatched an equaliser totally against the run of play as the match headed for injury time when Steve King scrambled in a scrappy equaliser.

The visitors completed the most unlikely comeback when Tony Stokes fired the Beachboys through to the final which they went on to win.

Bartlett said: "I'm over it now but it

"I think 4-0 to us would have been a fair reflection and their manager was in agreement. I'm still scratching my head as to how we didn't win it. I couldn't see them scoring in a month of Sundays.

"The best team does not always win a football match and over the 90 minutes we were comfortably the better team."

The Stones boss is adamant Concord were not one of the best sides in the league but claims their strength and con-

ditioning helped fire them to promotion. He said: "The bottom line is we're out and Concord are in the Conference South. What I would say about them is Concord's resilience and fitness has probably carried them through.

"I wouldn't put them in the top half a dozen teams in terms of quality but they have something that no-one else has got and they win games."

The Wealdstone manager insists he still

finds it hard to understand how his team lost at the semi-final stage for the second year in a row.

But he had nothing but praise for his players despite missing out again in the play-offs.
"It took me a couple of days but even

now, when I'm on my own, I still shake my head in disbelief.
"Full credit to the players because they

gave me everything I could have asked for.
