Bessborough's title bid sunk by Osterley loss

BESSBOROUGH's slim chances of winning the Middlesex Championship suffered a near-fatal blow on Saturday as they lost by 81 runs at home to Osterley

After being asked to bat, Osterley compiled a steady innings as four players were out in the 30s and 40s.

Amrinder Buttar top-scored on 47 as Osterley declared on 242 for nine after 50

Alexander Haniff was the pick of the Bessborough bowlers with three for 66, while Neal Patel (two for 69) and Rohan Karkhanis (two for 38) each picked up a couple of wickets.

Bessborough's reply could hardly have got off to a worse start as William Grogan gloved the ball to second slip for a duck and then in the same over Hawes was given out for four to a dubious LBW.

Calamity followed in the next over when Haniff (five) was adjudged to have left his crease, only for the keeper Bhatt to strike with a throw from ten yards away.

Two more LBWs - this time for Tharshan Kanagaraj (two) and Talha Junaid (seven) – had Bessborough reeling on 22

A spirited lower order fightback added respectability but Bessborough were eventually out in 36 overs, for 161.

This third-straight defeat sends Bessbor-ough to eighth place in the Middlesex Championship, 25 points behind Osterley (70 points) who are the new leaders.
