Stones chase FA Cup win over title rivals

Wealdstone manager Gordon Bartlett insists his side have nothing to fear ahead of their FA Cup clash at AFC Hornchurch on Saturday.

Their opponents are currently second in the Ryman Premier Division and will present a challenging third qualifying round tie. The two sides met in the league last month and drew 1-1 after a 96th minute equaliser from Hornchurch

Bartlett said: "They are near the top of our league and we know it's going to be a very difficult match. We were disappointed to draw with them earlier in the season when we felt we had the better of it.

"They scored five last week and are on the crest of a wave but we will go over and give it our best shot.
