Bartlett said: "They are a very well supporter club that are on the crest of a wave after winning promotion last

season.

"They are getting some very good results and they will be up there until the death but I expect us to be as well."

The Stones, who have signed midfielder Luke Pigden from Carshalton Athletic, earned a 3-1 home win over Grays Athletic last weekend.

Wealdstone got off to a poor start and were 1-0 down through Jeff Hammond's fifth minute opener.

Bartlett said: "We started very slowly but the good news is we responded very well. Some of our football in the second half was excellent
