Wealdstone suffered FA Trophy heartbreak after a 92nd minute goal fired Maidstone United to a 1-0 replay win on Tuesday night.

The Stones had looked in control of the tie, against the Ryman Premier Division leaders, when they led 2-0 on Saturday. But Maidstone fought back to force a replay which they edged after the dramatic finale at the Gallagher Stadium. Manager Gordon Bartlett said: "Football can be so cruel. It's a

Bartlett's side had looked on course to win the second qualifying round tie after going into a 2-0 lead in the first match.

Tom Pett's cross was headed home by Tom Hamblin and then a stunning team move helped extend the Stones lead when James Hammond's cross was finished off by McGleish
