# Stones' fixture congestion could hit promotion bid

Wealdstone manager Gordon Bartlett admits their mounting fixture congestion caused by the bad weather is making their promotion challenge much harder.

The Stones had two more matches postponed due to waterlogged pitches this week and Wealdstone have five games in hand on Ryman Premier Division leaders Maidstone United.

Bartlett said: "I still think there is some bad weather to come and it is certainly making our task of get-ting promotion more difficult.
