Stones performances 'have let club down'

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett was "extremely frustrated" with his players after a 2-1 loss to Bishop's Stortford on Tuesday, claiming inconsistent performances from the team have let the club down this season.

Goals from captain Anthony Church and Elliott Buchanan won the game for the Blues, cancelling out Shaun Lucien's leveller to keep the away side marooned in mid-table of the National League South. Bartlett said: "I think we shot our-

selves in the foot. "We were playing on a bobbly hard

surface but on too many occasions we haven't done ourselves justice. "There was very little between the two teams.

'We gave the ball away in a good area and they played in the conditions better than we did.

The Stones found themselves behind after failing to deal with a long throw, allowing Church to nick the ball home from close range.

The Blues were fortunate to maintain their lead when Jefferson Louis completely missed the ball at the back post after a low cross was sent

Although the home side started

the second period brightly, they quickly found themselves level when Lucien unleashed an unstoppable free-kick that looped over the wall and into the bottom left corner.

But Wealdstone were caught out by a perfectly weighted cross from loanee Robbie Willmott. Buchanan latched onto it in the box and anplied the neatest of touches to send it past North.

Bartlett said: "There was not a lot in the first half. We allowed the ball to bounce and got caught. They didn't cause us many problems but we didn't cause them many problems either.

"It was a great free-kick from Shaun and I thought we had the upper hand. I'm extremely frustrated with our inconsistency.

The Stones drew 0-0 at home to Maidenhead United last weekend and host relegation-threatened St Albans City on Saturday.

Bartlett says he expects an improvement from his players this weekend.

He said: "It has to be better. The ability in the squad has never been in question, but the application col-
