FOOTBALL: Skipper to remain for seventh season Parker signs new deal to stay at Wealdstone

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett thinks the direction of the club was behind captain Wes Parker's decision to sign a new one-year deal.

The 32-year-old has spent the majority of his professional career with the club, which he first joined from Gainsborough Trinity in 2010, and will now spend a seventh season at Grosvenor Vale. Bartlett told the Harrow Times:

Bartlett told the Harrow Times: "We worked hard to try to keep hold of the nucleus of the squad and I'm very pleased Wes has signed.

"It's important because he has been with us for a long time and is Wealdstone through and through.

"There's always other clubs interested and times move on, and you can't take anything for granted, but we sat down with him and it was clear his heart is at the football club."

Parker was on the scoresheet as Wealdstone went down 2-1 to QPR Under-21s at Grosvenor Vale on Saturday, in a game featuring a number of trialists, including former Welling striker Sehr Kabba.

gin with a trip to Dartford on August 6.

They will open their home campaign against nearby St Albans City two days later, at 7.45pm, before a Christmas double-header against Maidstone United.

They will finish the league campaign on April 29 at East Thurrock. Elsewhere, Nick Archer has been named Wealdstone vice-chairman following his departure from St Albans, to work under the club's new as yet unnamed chair.

Wealdstone confirmed his appointment on Monday, days after his former club was forced to release a statement following "an announcement on social media" to clarify he was still a director at the time, but he eventually left late last week.

He said: "The option was a very attractive one when I was approached by Wealdstone, it's a very well supported and run club with a strong board structure.

"It was an opportunity I had to grab with both hands. The chairman hasn't been unveiled yet but I like what he has to say."
