# Wealdstone beaten in pre-season friendlies

A MIXED bag of trialists and Wealdstone regulars fell to a 2-0 defeat at Biggleswade Town on Saturday.

From that point, Ricky Wellard began to come into the game, orchestrating some fine attacking moves through midfield, but they fell a second goal behind when Effiong struck before the break.

club last Thursday after a successful trial, had looked lively in the Stones' previous friendly with Leyton Orient and was again bright – but could not find his way past a resolute Waders defence.

The Stones were also beaten 3-2 by Egham Town on Tuesday night, with goals from Kabba and Jonny Wright not enough against their Evo-Stik League Southern Division 1 Central visitors. They will host Brackley Town on Saturday.

"I'm not in any rush, but I feel I'm ready to start climbing the rankings and fighting for titles.

"I want to get my name out there and get the big fights."

Smith, who boxed in the European Schoolboy championships as an amateur, has won all seven fights in his professional career.

He currently trains with Dave Streatfield in Kings Cross and says that for future fights, he plans to prepare in Marbella.

Smith said: "I've come back feeling fitter and stronger than ever.

"People are going to see a better Jez Smith at the York Hall this month."
