FOOTBALL: Bartlett boosted by summer changes

Boss urges positivity ahead of new season

AN "air of negativity" may have disappeared from Grosvenor Vale with a regime change at Wealdstone this summer.

Former Accrington chairman Peter Marsden was appointed in this position at Wealdstone last month, on the back of what boss Gordon Bartlett called his "worst season in memory" of 31 years in management.

Now he is feeling reinvigorated ahead of his 22nd season with the club, and with the Stones adding eight players ahead of the start of the new campaign, which begins a Dartford on Saturday, he has hopes of a top-ten finish for his side.

But first, he wants them to ensure they can build on the positive vibe of the close-season changes on and off the field.

Bartlett said: "This year is the first time we can say we can compete with the big boys, and we should go and enjoy that fact.

"Last year was probably the one I remember the least fondly of all, but there's a freshness about this season which is exciting.

"We've got a bit of an air of negativity around the club, but since we've been at Grosvenor Vale

we've been in two play-off campaigns, won the league, got to the FA Cup first round twice and had an FA Trophy semi-final here.

"I want to get people positive about where we are and what we're doing, and I've told the players that"

The Stones finished a stable 13th after a poor start to the season saw them with a solitary point from their opening six games, something Bartlett is, unsurprisingly, honing to better this time round

hoping to better this time round. He said: "We've got to set realistic targets, which is to finish in the top half. We've had some poor starts in the last two years and if we can have a half-decent first few weeks we should be OK. Ideally, I would like to flirt with the upper reaches of the table.

"If we can get six games in with ten points on the table, that gives us a good start. Anything more than that and I'll be delighted."

The Stones finished off their preseason campaign with a 2-1 win at Wingate and Finchley on Tuesday night, with Elliot Benyon and Ricky Wellard on target.
