FOOTBALL: Stones finally rolling under Wilkinson

Wealdstone get back to winning ways at Vale

WEALDSTONE finally got up and running under Bobby Wilkinson with a pair of home wins to move them a point off the top half of the National League South table.

A 3-0 triumph over Bognor Regis Town on Saturday and a 4-1 drubbing of Poole Town on Monday had Wilkinson relieved as the Stones shook off a four-game winless start to his managerial reign.

The club has struggled to enjoy home comforts over the past few years - something not lost on the new boss - and looked nervous in the first-half of what ended a comfortable victory over Bognor to start the week.

Danny Green broke the deadlock with a 30-yard free-kick, but only after the break did the hosts begin to look confident, and Ryan Sellers scored a rare goal with a brilliant swerving shot, and Ciaron Brown rounded off the afternoon late on.

Monday night brought another three points but seven blink-andyou'll-miss-it minutes had Poole on the ropes, as Matty Whichelow grabbed a brace and Abobaker Eisa scored a third before the interval.

He said:"I had a meeting on Thursday and spoke about the first four games, and we were pleased with the three draws but wanted better.

"I got an outcome last weekend which showed a lot of people who had been saying the boys don't have the passion of the heart that they definitely do.

"It was an unbelievable achievement getting beaten 5-1 on the Tuesday and then winning two games and scoring seven goals in 48 hours."

The new manager has chosen his words carefully when commenting on any matters before his arrival, and perhaps wisely given the regard former manager Gordon Bartlett is held on the back of his 22-year tenure.
