FOOTBALL: Stones easily coast beyond Hayes

Wealdstone through in Middlesex Cup

WEALDSTONE powered into the quarter-finals of the Middlesex Senior Challenge Cup with a 3-0 win over Hayes and Yeading at Grosvenor Vale on Tuesday night.

In the only game of the week, first-half goals from Ryan Sellers, Abobaker Eisa and Shaun Okojie - on his debut after arriving on loan from Aldershot Town on Monday - left the second 45 as little more than a training exercise.

A near full-strength side was fielded by manager Bobby Wilkinson, with eight of the starting 11 which had won at Welling United last time out named in the Stones' line-up.

And they waved away any cobwebs after 10 days without a game, taking a sixth-minute lead through Sellers, whose shot was saved by Luke Daley, only for the ball to eventually squirm through his fingers.

It was a case of deja vu for the second-choice Hayes keeper 23 minutes in, when Eisa cut inside and hit an admittedly powerful shot goalwards, but one that the stopper should have done better to keep out.

Eisa could have ended the half with a hat-trick, but instead missed two other efforts and it was Okojie who ended up on the scoresheet.

He nodded in a close-range header to finish a tie Hayes had barely participated in, only coming close twice early on with the score goalless.

Okojie and Matty Whichelow both came close after the break but neither side added to the scoreline, and the Stones can now look forward to hosting Hungerford on Saturday.
