FOUR wins in a row for in-form Wealdstone

Stones extend winning run with home victory

WEALDSTONE climbed to within five points of the National League South play-offs after a 2-1 home win over Weston-super-Mare on Saturday.

The Stones clinched their fourth consecutive win in all competitions which temporarily helped them leapfrog their opponents in the table.

Iffy Allen made an immediate impact on his league debut with the Bromley loanee firing Bobby Wilkinson's side into the lead.

There was an early let off for the Stones with Jake Lee's header crashing against the crossbar.

Starting in place of the suspended Ricky Wellard, Allen grabbed the opening goal after just eight minutes.

He latched onto a neat knockdown from David Pratt and tucked his effort past goalkeeper Luke Purnell.

Wealdstone were in control of the match and threatened to add to their lead.

off the outside of the post

Winger Eisa then saw another effort hit the woodwork as the visitors had a fortunate escape.

The Stones kept the pressure on during the second half and were rewarded with their second goal in the 57th minute.

It was a superb individual effort with Eisa running from inside his own half before unleashing a fierce strike.

Wealdstone were looking comfortable until the side were reduced to 10 men in the 80th minute.

Ian Gayle was shown a second yellow card which handed the visitors a late lifeline.

Weston took advantage of the extra man and pulled a goal back with five minutes remaining through a header from Gethyn Hill.

But Wealdstone managed to hold out with relatively few scares as they secured back-to-back league victories.

The Stones turn their attention to the FA Trophy on Saturday with a home game against Warrington Town in the third round.

Warrington are currently in fifth place in the Evo-Stik Premier Division.
