WEALDSTONE post back-to-back victories

Stones goalkeeper North agrees new contract

WEALDSTONE goalkeeper Jonathan North has signed a new contract which will keep him at the club until the end of next season.

Former Watford keeper North has been in excellent form this season for the Stones and his new deal is a boost to the club heading into the next campaign. He has made 337 appearances for Wealdstone.

The Stones clinched a second win of the week on Monday after a 3-1 victory at Hungerford Town.

Bobby Wilkinson enjoyed a successful return to his former club as Wealdstone produced a dominant performance.

The visitors got off to an ideal start, taking the lead after just three minutes, when Dan Fitchett managed to touch the ball into the net from Danny Green's free-kick.

Hungerford almost equalised but North produced two superb saves to keep out efforts from Scott Rees and Lewis Leigh-Gilchrist.

Wealdstone doubled their lead eight minutes before the break when Matty Whichelow's through ball released Ryan Sellers and the defender fired his effort into the net.

But the hosts pulled one back after the break when Alfie Kilgour scored

from close range.

The Stones came under pressure from Hungerford as the home side pushed for an equaliser.

But Wealdstone were handed the chance to restore their advantage when David Pratt was tripped in the area by James Rusby. Green fired the penalty into the net to give the visitors a two-goal cushion.

North still had to be alert to save two late efforts from Louie Soares.

It was Wealdstone's second victory in a row after their 2-1 home win over Bath City on Saturday.

The Stones had to fight back from a goal down to overcome ten man Bath at Grosvenor Vale.

The visitors made a bright start to the match and North was called upon to save headers from Miles Welch-Haves and Antoine Semenyo.

Bath opened the scoring before half-time, when they were awarded a penalty after Jerome Okimo handled Opi Edwards' cross. Matt Richards converted the spot-kick to give Bath the lead heading into the second half.

Eddie Oshodi and Dylan Kearney were brought on at the break
