COMFORTABLE victory follows thrilling draw

Dominant first half brings disappointing run to end

WEALDSTONE brought their fourgame winless run to an end on Monday night as they comfortably beat East Thurrock United 3-0 at Grosvenor Vale.

Goals from Bradley Bubb, Ricky Wellard and Jeffrey Monakana sealed the win for Bobby Wilkinson's men, which moved them up to 11th place in the National League South.

After captain Jerome Okimo came within inches of opening the scoring when his effort from the edge of the area flew just wide, the Stones took the lead in the 11th minute when Wellard's cross was nodded home by Bubb.

BOROUGH END THEIR AWAY CAMPAIGN WITH FOUR-GOAL WIN AT WANDERERS

HARROW Borough ended their away campaign on a high with an impressive 4-0 victory at Dorking Wanderers on Tuesday night to enjoy a rare move into the top half of the table.

The win built on Saturday's 1-0 triumph at Needham Market and extended Borough's strong end to the season to one defeat in eight games heading into Saturday's last fixture at home to relegation-threatened Burgess Hill Town.

After settling into the game, Steve Baker's side soon began to take charge and went in front in the 16th minute when following a corner, Michael Bryan cut the ball back to Adam Richards to find the bottom corner.

That was the catalyst for half-of-anhour of football unsurpassed this season as Harrow took complete control.
