St Marys suffer firstday defeat

HARROW TOWN FARE BETTER AS NEW CRICKET SEASON GETS UNDER WAY

IT was a disappointing start to the season for Harrow St Marys on Saturday as they lost by three wickets away to Stanmore in the Middlesex County Cricket League.

Three wickets in quick succession proved to be St Marys' downfall, as Pritesh Vaghela, Aaman Soni and Tom Pettet were all dimissed one after another, leaving the Division Two side at 72-5.

But Jaimit Patel scored 39 and Kunj Thakkar added 21 from 15 balls late on to leave St Marys with a total of 168-6 to defend.

It was to prove insufficient though, with Stanmore reaching the target as scores of 41 from Kusk Patel and 34 from Marc Reingold helped the home side reach 172-7 to secure the three-wicket victory.

Having reduced Stanmore to 52-4, St Marys were well in the game but their opponents put on almost 100 for the next two wickets to take control.

Harrow Town enjoyed better fortunes in Division Three as they started their campaign in style with a 36-run win over North London.

Harrow batted first and set a target of 217 for their opponents to chase, thanks to notable contributions from Mohamed Gouse (58), Muhammad Arshad (48) and Tharindu Denipitiyage (42).

However, Town's bowlers were in top form, as three wickets apiece from Uzairuddin Mohammed and Denipitiyage helped bowl North London all out for 181, securing Harrow the win and 10 points.
