Encouraging start to the season for Wealdstone

BOBBY Wilkinson's Wealdstone have enjoyed an unbeaten start to the National League South season, with Saturday's 4-1 win over Weston-super-Mare being backed up by a 1-1 draw with Hungerford Town in mid-week.

The Stones certainly weren't hanging about against Weston at the Vale, as they got off to a flying start when Stevenage loanee Joe White opened the scoring inside two minutes.

After White saw an effort hit the upright moments later, David Pratt would double the Stones' advantage in the sixth minute when he sent a low effort past the despairing dive of Luke Purnell.

The visitors pulled one back against the run of play 20 minutes later when some untypically lax defending allowed Eli Phipps to race through and poke past Jonathan North.

But that didn't stop Wealdstone's momentum and having struck the post from 30 yards, Bradley Hudson-Odoi would get his name on the scoresheet in his first match since returning to the Ruislip club when he burst forward and sent a low effort into the bottom corner.

Wilkinson's men had further chances to seal the victory before the break and they would start the second half in similar fashion, with

But Pratt wouldn't be denied, as he notched his second of the game with five minutes remaining when he raced through and arrowed a low effort into the bottom corner to seal the win.

Pratt would get on the scoresheet again on Tuesday, as Wealdstone were held by Wilkinson's former team Hungerford thanks to a late penalty from Harvey Bradbury.

Danny Green brought the best out of Hungerford's Jokull Andresson early on, when the goalkeeper did superbly well to acrobatically tip over the midfielder's 30-yard-strike. Pratt then notched his third goal

Pratt then notched his third goal of the season on the half-hour mark, as after his initial effort was well saved by Andresson, the Wealdstone striker reacted quickest to poke home at the second time of asking to hand Wilkinson's side the lead

Hudson-Odoi then forced another good save from the Hungerford goal-keeper and the Stones would start the second half in similar fashion, with Green orchestrating chances for Connor Stevens, Wadah Ahmidi as well as Pratt within five minutes of the restart.

Wealdstone almost grabbed a second, but Hudson-Odoi's deflected free-kick was cleared off the line and the Stones' failure to increase their advantage proved to be costly, as Bradbury got Hungerford back on level terms from the spot after Conor Lynch was brought down by Godfrey Poku.

Hungerford almost nicked it right

at the death against the run of play when James Rusby's cross was headed toward his own goal by Stevens, but Wealdstone had North to thank after he pulled off a five save to tip the ball around the post.

The Stones will be looking to build on their promising start to the season when they take on Billericay Town on Saturday.
