HARROW Borough beat leaders Taunton Town thanks to a first-half goal in the Evo-Stik Southern Premier League South on Saturday afternoon before losing 3-1 at home against Welling United in the London Senior Cup semi-final on Tuesday.

Ryan Moss calmly converted from the penalty spot for Borough after 26 minutes against Taunton when Anthony O'Connor was hacked down in the box after he had picked up Adam Pepera's through ball.
