WIN against Hemel could seal top-seven spot One game left for Stones to reach the play-offs

WEALDSTONE could still make the National League South play-offs on the final day of the season after beating Chelmsford City on Monday, despite losing at home to Dulwich Hamlet earlier in the weekend.

Two goals from Connor Hunte had Hamlet two goals to the good at the break, and Dipo Akinyemi's penalty rounded things off before a late Stones consolation by Freddie Grant.

Wealdstone looked the brighter side from the outset and created two good opportunities within the first minute of the game. Daniel Green was denied by Preston Edwards and, from the resulting corner, he denied Jeffrey Monakana before David Pratt poked wide.

Hamlet though, took the lead significantly against the run of play in the 19th minute when Hunte cut onto his left foot from the right wing and fired low into the far corner beyond Jonathan North.

The hosts responded well and looked likely to get an equaliser, and they almost found it when Christian Smith combined well with Grant who nodded down for Pratt, but the striker again fired wide.

gerous in the closing stages and after North produced an excellent save from Akinyemi's header, he could do nothing about Hunte's stunning free-kick four minutes later that doubled the lead.

Hamlet rode the pressure in the second half and were awarded a penalty on the counter attack, which was coolly converted by Akinyemi to effectively end the game.

The Stones did finally get on the scoresheet late on when Grant fired home a wonderful strike into the top corner, but the damage was already done and Hamlet took the points.

Wealdstone had no such problems on Monday though, and they kept their play-off hopes alive with an excellent win away at fourth-placed Chelmsford City.

Daniel Green gave the visitors the lead at the break, and early secondhalf goals from Tarryn Allarakhia and an Adrian Cascaval own goal kept them in the hunt for seventh spot.

Wealdstone broke the deadlock when Grant backheeled into the path of Green, and he hit a stunning half-volley with the outside

With the points safely in the bag, Bobby Wilkinson's men can now go into the final game of the season on Saturday at home to Hemel Hempstead Town knowing that a win could see them clinch the final playoff spot.
