# Stones beat Hemel to snatch play-off spot

A sensational second-half display coupled with other results miraculously going their way saw Wealdstone make the National League South play-offs with a 2-1 win over Hemel Hempstead Town.

Jason Williams gave Hemel a half-time lead but second-half strikes from Freddie Grant and Jake Sheppard set up a meeting with Bath City in the play-offs, finishing ahead of Billericay Town, St Albans City, Dartford and Slough Town.

The visitors made the brighter start and created the first goalscoring opportunity as Williams let fly, but his first-minute effort flew just wide of the far post.

The Stones tested goalkeeper Laurie Walker for the first time when Daniel Green's free-kick was blocked and Sheppard crossed back in for Grant, but Walker produced a comfortable save.

The Tudors began to dominate as the half went on and they were duly rewarded for their efforts in the 36th minute when Williams beat the offside trap and chipped the ball over the on-rushing Jonathan North from outside the area to give them the lead.

The hosts went into the break behind, knowing only a win would maintain their play-off dream, and they went some way to restoring that dream two minutes after the restart when Tarryn Allara khia threaded through for Grant. His original cross rebounded off the post but he followed it up brilliantly, slamming past Walker to equalise.

Spurred on by the goal, Wealdstone began to dictate the tempo and they subsequently found their way through again in the 56th minute when Walker expertly lobbed Walker from outside the box.

The Stones pushed on more and more after the goal, desperate to ensure the three points, and they came agonisingly close on a number of occasions through Sheppard, Godfrey Poku and Christian Smith but some resolute defending preserved the lead.

The dramatic final day victory meant Wealdstone faced fifth-placed Bath City in their play-off eliminator at Twerton Park last night (Wednesday).
