Town win as Harrow struggle

ONE POINT SEPARATES HARROW SIDES IN TABLE



HARROW Town recorded their second Middlesex County Cricket League Division Three victory of the season with a big nine-wicket win over bottom side Indian Gymkhana.

The away side won the toss and elected to field first, and Gymkhana got off to a terrible start, losing two wickets having posted just three runs.

Thankfully for them, third-wicket pairing Ameet Matharu (38) and Rhythm Bedo (68) made a combined score of 81 to improve their prospects before the former's dismissal after being bowled by Uzairuddin Mohammed, but Gymkhana were to be all out for 131.

Town only needed three batsmen to come into the middle to surpass the total set in Gymkhana's innings, though it did take them until 30 overs as opener Arun Ayyavooruja (56 not out) maintained his presence at the crease throughout, being joined at the crease by both Asim Mohammed (51), who was the only wicket to fall, and Herath (18 not out).

Meanwhile, Harrow CC dropped down the table after Southgate inflicted a heavy eight-wicket defeat on them.

Harrow elected to bat first after winning the toss but struggled all of the way through their innings. The opening partnership of Sachin Patel (7) and Nathan Fernandes (7) scored just 14 together before they were both dismissed within the opening three wickets to fall.

Abdulwasey Mohamed (2) and Syan Bulathsinhala, who top-scored with 15, provided the most effective partnership for the visitors, but Southgate easily made up the 79-run chase through Jamie Jounen's 41, which helped them to 80 for two.

More deals for Stones

WEALDSTONE have completed the signing of Oxford United forward Dejon Noel-Williams And Aldershot Town's Nick Arnold.

Noel-Williams, 20, was part of the academy set-up at the League One side having joined from Premier League club Watford in 2016.

He is also the son of former Hornets, Stoke City and Burnley striker Gifton Noel Williams and spent time on a work experience at non-league side Burnham while his father was the manager at the club.

Last season, the striker had two spells in the National League South, firstly with Slough Town and later with Gloucester City, scoring two goals with the latter as they avoided relegation from the division.

New Stones boss Dean Brennan told the club's website: "Dejon is a player we have tracked throughout his youth career.

"He will give our team power and pace at the top end of the pitch.

"He likes to play on the shoulder which

is hard to find these days and he knows where the goal is.

"We are looking forward to working with Dejon. He is a player that excites me."

The Stones have also completed a deal for Aldershot full-back Nick Arnold.

The 25-year-old came through the academy at Reading and was offered professional terms by the club in 2011, and he then joined Wycombe Wanderers on loan for the 2013/14 season, where he made more than 30 appearances.

Following his spell with the Chairboys, Arnold had a short spell at Woking in 2014 before joining Whitehawk later that year, where he spent two years before linking up with Aldershot.

During his two-year stint at the Hampshire outfit, Arnold received one cap for the England C team in a game against Estonia Under-23s.
