## Borough win three in a row

HARROW Borough continued with their third consecutive victory on Tuesday night as they beat Camberley Town 2-0 away from home.

Two second-half goals from Frank Keita and Max Holland eventually separated the two sides following a goalless first period.

The deadlock was eventually broken from the spot, after Harry Crawford had been bundled over in the box as he was preparing to shoot.

Keita coolly dispatched the penalty.

Then five minutes from the end of the match, Holland added a second from close range to ensure Borough maintained their 100 per cent win record in pre-season.

That record had looked in doubt in their previous game away at Spelthorne Sports, when they went behind after 25 minutes.

However, Keita levelled things up just after the half-hour mark, again from the penalty spot, before Charlie Malin headed in a second following a cross from Ant O'Connor early on in the second half.

The game was put firmly beyond Spelthorne in the 64th minute when O'Connor latched onto Holland's pass to make it 3-1, sealing a good second win for Harrow.

Their first came the Saturday before when they travelled away to Hampton and Richmond Borough and came away 2-1 winners.

Harrow opened the scoring early on in the second half after both sides had drawn a blank in the first, when Excellence Muhemba stepped up to the convert from the penalty spot.

The hosts levelled the game shortly after through striker Ryan Hill, before David Carty put the visitors back in front immediately after.

# Stones lose to Colchester

WEALDSTONE suffered a 3-0 defeat at the hands of League Two Colchester United in a pre-season friendly on Tuesday evening after Sunday's legends match in celebration of Gordon Bartlett and Leo Morris ended in a 3-1 win for Queens Park Rangers.

Colchester visited the Vale on Tuesday evening as part of pre-season preparations and a first-half goal from Paris Cowan-Hall, followed up by second-half finishes from Michael Fernandes and Luke Gambin sent them away with the victory.

It took little more than 15 minutes for the League Two side to break the deadlock when Jevani Brown's strike was parried by Theo Richardson into the path of Cowan-Hall, who tapped the ball into the empty net.

Stones boss Dean Brennan used the match to assess the full depth of his squad and made 10 changes on the hour mark, but they were unable to prevent Fernandes from doubling the lead six minutes later when he latched onto a flick from Gambin before rounding Rich-

ardson and scoring.

Gambin turned from provider to scorer with 10 minutes to go when his shot crept beneath Richardson and rolled into the net.

The previous Sunday saw the Stones honouring club legends Bartlett and Morris with a game against QPR legends.

Two late goals from Dennis Oli and Scott McGleish eventually separated the two sides after Tommy Smith's opener for Rangers was cancelled out by a super Scott McCubbin strike.

Featuring for Wealdstone on the day were members of the 2014 Ryman League Champions squad, including captain Wes Parker, while QPR were represented by the likes of current Wycombe Wanderers manager Gareth Ainsworth and Marcus Bean. All funds raised from the game have gone to both the Wealdstone FC Foundation Trust and the QPR Trust.
