After two Danny Green efforts were dealt with early on, Lafayette broke the deadlock in the 32nd minute when Green played the striker in down the right for him to finish past Jake Shepperd. Wealdstone continued to create the bet-

ter chances after the break and came closest through Billy Clifford when he had the ball flicked into his path by Lafayette, but substitute keeper Simon Andersson did well to deny him.

The Stones' domination finally paid dividends in the 84th minute when they scored a second. Dennon Lewis beat his man down the left and played a perfect square ball inside to Lafayette, and he coolly finished to make it a comfortable win.

Harrow Borough beat Potters Bar

HARROW Borough recorded an entertaining 4-3 victory over Potters Bar Town in a pre-season friendly on Tuesday night.

George Fenton and Adam Pepera gave Borough an early advantage, while a brace from Ant O'Connor ensured a late fightback from Potters Bar was in vain. It took only four minutes for Fen-

ton to break the deadlock, racing through despite claims of offside to make it 1-0.

The hosts extended their lead six minutes later when Potters Bar con-ceded a silly free-kick, and Pepera was there to convert from the delivery to put Borough firmly in control during the early stages.
