## Improved Borough gain point

GEORGE MOORE FREE-KICK RESCUES DRAW ON TRAVELS



Harrow Borough secured a point against Weston-Super-Mare.

An improved performance from Harrow Borough saw them collect a point in a 1-1 draw away at Weston-Super-Mare on Tuesday.

Weston took the lead just before half-time through Joel Randall but Harrow secured just their second point since September through George Moore's late free-kick.

The Seagulls seized the initiative after 41 minutes following a positive start when Randall skipped around the challenge of Adam Pepera and fired into the corner past Hafed Al-Droubi. Despite being behind, it was a vastly improved display from Harrow in comparison to recent weeks, giving the travelling fans some hope at the break.

Al-Droubi kept Weston at bay in the second half and the substitute pairing of Kunle Otudeko and Excellence Muhemba provided some positivity going forward.

However, it was Moore who rescued the point, curling in a wonderful free-kick with just two minutes to go.

The losing streak had continued for Steve Baker's side at the weekend when they were beaten 2-0 by AFC Sudbury in the FA Trophy.

Billy Holland and Sean Marks got on the scoresheet for the hosts, who will travel to Worthing in the second qualifying round as a result of causing this upset.

Harrow's best chance came when Muhemba got to the loose ball after Chinua Cole's shot had been blocked, but his rebound bounced back off the post.

Sudbury go through to face Worthing away from home in the next round, while Harrow's next game comes in the Southern League Premier Division South this Saturday away at Dorchester Town.

## Win streak continues

WEALDSTONE secured their place in the second round of the Middlesex Charity Cup with a 5-1 win over CB Hounslow United on Tuesday.

Dejon Noel-Williams scored a first-half brace while further goals came from Afolabi Coker, Sanchez Watt and Eric Lopes.

Forward Noel-Williams netted the opener when he was slipped in by Enoch Ekongo after two minutes, and the same amount of time later he doubled his tally when he chested home Enoch Andoh's cross.

Another two minutes later, the Stones were out of sight as Jacob Mendy's cross was headed home by Coker at the far post, but Hounslow finally mustered a response on 10 minutes as Trent Skapetis tapped into an empty net.

Wealdstone bagged a fourth before half-time when Billy Clifford played in Watt who powered into the bottom corner.

It looked as though the half-time score would remain unchanged until the end, but Lopes smashed home a fifth for good

measure late on.

Dean Brennan's side also extended their lead at the top of the National League South to seven points at the weekend with a 3-1 win at home against Tonbridge Angels.

Christ Tiehi's own goal and Billy Clifford's effort had the Stones two ahead before D'Sean Theobolds pulled one back, but Noel-Williams sealed the points late on.

Wealdstone found their rhythm early on and took the lead when Michee Etefe's low cross cannoned in off Tiehi.

Clifford doubled the lead after the break when he converted the rebound from his saved penalty, but Tonbridge pulled one back with a penalty of their own that was tucked away by Theobolds.

Noel-Williams, though, made sure of the points with a powerful finish across the keeper in stoppage time.

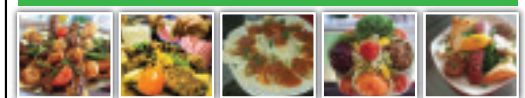
