Harrow lose on penalties

HARROW Borough lost 5-4 on penalties to Hampton & Richmond Borough in the Middlesex Senior Cup on Tuesday night.

After falling two goals behind, strikes from Junon Akintude and George Moore in the final 10 minutes forced a shootout but it was the hosts who progressed into the quarter finals.

Borough blew a two-goal lead to fall to a 3-2 home loss against Swindon Supermarine on Saturday.

Goals from Moore and Manny Williams put Harrow in a commanding position with just 15 minutes to play, but Ryan Campbell's brace and a Michael Hopkins penalty gave Swindon an unlikely three points.

At a rain-swept Earlsmead Stadium, the visitors started on the front foot as Hafed Al-Droubi had to be alert to keep out Stuart Fleetwood's header.

Harrow responded with Lewis Cole being denied twice early on by goalkeeper Martin Horsell.

There were opportunities at both ends after the interval. First, Williams nodded

With the match in the balance, Harrow struck the opener in the 71st minute when Williams slipped in Moore on the left side of the box and he cut inside the defender to finish.

The hosts doubled their lead just two minutes later courtesy of Williams' powerful strike after some neat build-up play.

Substitute Campbell immediately got his side back into the game when he arrived at the back post ahead of Shaun Preddie and slotted home, and the same player equalised with 10 minutes to go when he seized on George Fenton's misplaced pass.

The capitulation was complete in the 88th minute as Fenton chopped down a Swindon attacker in the area and Hopkins converted the penalty. Stones have two games postponed

NO GAME IN NEARLY TWO WEEKS FOR WEALDSTONE

WEALDSTONE have now failed to play a game in nearly two weeks after both of their Vanarama National League South fixtures were postponed this week.

On Saturday, the Stones were scheduled to be in action against Eastbourne Borough, however the club were forced to postpone the match due to floodlight technical problems.

Then on Tuesday, Wealdstone were due to be playing away against Billericay Town, but the fixture was also called off due to a waterlogged pitch. Information on re-arranged dates

Meanwhile, the draw for the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Trophy was made on Monday, with Wealdstone getting a home tie against BetVictor Southern League Premier side Royston Town. The match is due to be played on Saturday, November 23.

The Stones have also announced the signing of former Arsenal academy midfielder Jack Jebb from National League South rivals Welling United on an undisclosed fee.

The 24-year-old spent two loan spells as Stevenage while still with the Gunners before joining the Hertfordshire side permanently in 2015.

He failed to make an impact there and swiftly moved onto Newport County before then having spells with Sutton United and Welling, scoring nine times in 48 games for the latter.

Wealdstone are next due to be in league action on Saturday when they travel to Hampton and Richmond Borough, who have lost their last two league matches. Kick off is at 3pm.
