WEALDSTONE will provide priority access to season ticket holders next season, should games be played in front of reduced crowds.

Currently no supporters are allowed in football stadiums due to the coronavirus pandemic, but with next season expected to begin sometime in September, it is thought there could be a chance of some supporters being permitted to enter grounds by then. This week Prime Minister Boris

This week Prime Minister Boris Johnson announced that pubs would be allowed to open their doors once again from next weekend as the country's lockdown measures are further reduced. While stadiums are not yet permit-

While stadiums are not yet permitted to allow supporters in, by September that may well have changed. Stones are looking ahead to next

Stones are looking ahead to next season already having been crowned champions of the National League South. They will play in English football's fifth tier for the first time since 1988.

Considering all possibilities, Wealdstone say they have already started to make preparations in the event that some supporters are allowed to watch games from the terraces next season.

In a statement published to their website, the club said: "This campaign will be our first in the fifth tier since 1988 and we want to make sure none of our most loyal supporters miss out on the opportunity to watch the Stones during these uncertain times.

"That is why we have introduced priority admission for season ticket holders at home games next season, in the event of any restrictions on capacity due to social distancing guidelines."
