Browne bags brace in win

WEALDSTONE manager Stuart Maynard has described new signing Rhys Browne as "outstanding" after his brace sealed a 2-1 pre-season friendly win over Dorking Wanderers at the weekend.

The victory ended Dorking's unbeaten pre-season campaign in which they had come out on top of all nine of their previous games.

Stones meanwhile remain unbeaten from their preparation matches.

The Antigua and Barbuda international who joined earlier this summer bagged both goals in the victory at the weekend, which impressed his new boss greatly.

Speaking in a club interview after the match, Maynard said Browne was a player with "serious ability".

"After 10 minutes, we changed it tactically, slightly tweaked it, and it got us back in the game. And then we dominated the game?" be said.

"He probably won't get many of them this season, but Rhys has come in and he's been outstanding for us this preseason. He's got serious ability," said the Stones boss.

"And he does the other side of the game, which people don't realise, he actually works hard for the team. He does a great job for the team. He was outstanding today.

"It was the test that we needed at this stage of the season. They're ready to go for the league next season and I think they'll be right in the mix next year."
