advantage by heading Kyran Lofthouse's cross into the bottom corner of George Wickens' net.

Josh Umerah reduced the arrears with a 69th-minute header, but Wealdstone could not find an equaliser despite applying fierce late pressure.

After the match, Stones manager Stuart Maynard said he was frustrated to see his side undone by something they had been expecting, but that there were positives to take from the second half performance.

"It's frustrating in the first half because their two goals have come from

Borough lose at Salisbury

HARROW DEFEATED ON LEAGUE OPENING DAY

HARROW returned pointless from their trip to Wiltshire at the weekend as they were beaten 2-1 by Salisbury on their opening week of the season.

Imran Uche opened the scoring for the visitors with a wonderstrike inside the first ten minutes, but the hosts went on to turn the game on its head through goals from Charlie Da-vis and Yemi Odubade.

Borough who went in front after just seven minutes with a world class finish from Uche, who latched onto Marc Charles-Smith's pass before looking up to hammer an unstoppa-ble left-foot howitzer past a flailing Marcus Beauchamp from 25 yards.

Harrow threatened twice late on with two Moore efforts, but it was not to be and Salisbury held on for the three points.
