STONES beat Altrincham but lose at Notts County | Two wins

Wealdstone beaten away

WEALDSTONE ran unbeaten Notts County close at Meadow Lane but ultimately slipped to a 3-2 defeat.

Wealdstone went ahead after 31 minutes on Tuesday night as Josh Umerah bundled home from close range after Jerome Okimo's initial effort had caused panic in the Magpies' defence.

However, County turned it around with two goals in the final five minutes of the first half to go into the interval ahead.

Callum Roberts levelled after 41 minutes when he turned in Kairo Mitchell's left-wing cross before Kyle Wotton started and finished the move on the stroke of half-time to put County into the lead.

Kyle Cameron then extended that advantage after 57 minutes, heading home a Matt Palmer corner before Wealdstone pulled one back when Alex Dyer evaded a couple of Magpies tackles before playing in Umerah for his second.

Wealdstone, who sit 17th in the National League standings, went into the clash off the back of a dramatic 1-0 win against Altrincham at the Vale.

The victory was Wealdstone's first of the season and came via a stoppage time penalty from Medy Elito.

Four minutes shy of half time, the Stones looked to have broken the deadlock when Jack Cook surged forward and laid the ball to Rhys Browne on the edge of the box. He beat his man and fired towards goal but the Robins' number one Tony Thompson produced a fine save to deny the home side.

But, nine minutes into stoppage time, the visitors were reduced to 10 men when Bradley Jackson was red carded for bringing down Craig Fasanmade.

And there was still time for Stones to secure the win as Elito coolly slotted home from the penalty spot as his first goal for the club secured all three points.

Wealdstone will now be looking for another home victory this weekend when they host Aldershot Town.

HARROW Borough bagged two wins in the space of four days to move up to 11th in Southern League Premier South.

Harrow faced a tough looking trip to Farnborough on Tuesday night but dug deep to secure a brilliant 3-1 victory

James Ewington put Harrow in front after 17 minutes before the hosts hit back with Sam Deering levelling the scores just 10 minutes later.

However, Harrow replied and took control of the match towards the end of the first half with two goals in quick succession.

Samuel Adenola put Harrow back in front in the 43rd minute before Ewington bagged his second goal of the night in first half stoppage time to put the visitors in a commanding position.

Harrow also triumphed at the weekend, beating Weston-super-Mare 1-0 with a late effort Joseph Otudeko securing all three points. Showing a depth in the squad that

Harrow will now be looking to continue their good run when they head to Welling United in the second qualifying round of the FA Cup this weekend.
